For cleft palate.

For the transition from Frenchay

In addition for Bristol please can I request the same set of data for 2012, 2013, 2014 and 2015 to understand the effect of the cleft teams move from Frenchay to the Bristol Royal Infirmary had on surgical wait times.

Please can you also provide data for any palate surgery on infants that has breached priority 2 FSSA guidance set up during covid and and lip surgery that has breached priority 3 FSSA guidance without a specified co-founder or reason such as III health or another medical condition that took priority over cleft surgery.
