CLINICAL DIRECTOR FOR CLINICAL RADIOLOGY

The post holder is responsible for providing clinical and professional leadership of Clinical Radiology services with particular emphasis on managing the consultant/medical staff, in order to support the trust's overall strategy and the day to day delivery of the highest quality health service.

The post holder will be a full and active member of the Diagnostics and Therapies Divisional Board and will chair the Radiology Executive Committee.

The post holder is professionally accountable for consultant/medical staff within the service as agreed with the Clinical Chair of Diagnostics and Therapies.

The post holder is responsible for managing the consultant/medical staff including recruitment, job planning, managing performance, managing attendance and ensuring compliance with Trust Healthcare and Health and Safety standards. The post holder is jointly responsible for the consultant/medical staff budget with the Head of Service for Clinical Radiology.

The post holder is expected to work closely with the Head of Service for Clinical Radiology to deliver a radiology service to a standard and budget agreed with the Divisional Director and Clinical Chair of the Division, seeking to achieve and maintain accreditation of the service with the Imaging Services Accreditation Scheme.


The post holder is responsible for maintaining good clinical governance within the Clinical Radiology service.

The post holder is responsible for developing strategic plans for the Clinical Radiology service within the Trust and wider health community.

The post is managerially accountable to the Divisional Director (and through him/her jointly to the Trust's Chief Operating Officer and Chief Executive) and professionally responsible to the Clinical Chair (and through him/her to the Medical Director). The post holder will be supported by the Divisional Finance Manager and the Divisional Human Resources Business Partner.

The post is for three years (subject to satisfactory yearly review and appraisal). It may be extended at the end of the three years for any period up to a further three years.

The post attracts payment equivalent to 2 programmed sessions.
