Thank you for your request for information under the Freedom of Information Act 2000. The Trust's response is as follows:

Please see below a request for the following information relating to tongue tie in babies aged 0-12 months.

• How many babies were born within your trust between Jan 1st 2022 and December 31st 2022?

# How many babies were diagnosed with ankyloglossia (tongue tie) between Jan1st 2022 and December 31 2022 at your trust?

Our systems do not record this information.

## • On average how many days after birth was a tongue tie diagnosis made between Jan 1st 2022 and December 31st 2022?

Our systems do not record this information.

### • How many babies diagnosed with tongue tie were referred for a frenotomy procedure (tongue tie division) between Jan 1st 2022 and December 31st 2022?

We had 536 referrals for assessment. Not all of them would have resulted in a diagnosis. Of those diagnosed, 286 had a frenotomy. A proportion of those diagnosed would have chosen or been recommended conservative management (ie NOT had a frenotomy) but that proportion is unknown.

### • Is the frenotomy procedure (tongue tie division) available to babies who are fully formula fed?

• How many frenotomy procedures (tongue tie division) were carried out on babies at your trust between Jan 1st 2022 and December 31st 2022? 286
