Thank you for your request for information under the Freedom of Information Act 2000. The Trust's response is as follows:

- We can confirm that we do hold the information you are requesting

1. Did your Trust alter or update its visitor policy in response to Covid-19, yes or no?

Yes

a. If yes, what changes were introduced?

On 23 March 2020 the Trust responded to the Covid-19 pandemic, in line with the Government's guidance, and suspended visiting to all hospitals across the Trust. Exceptions were agreed on compassionate grounds, including vulnerable patients and dementia or learning disabilities, patients with a key carer and patients receiving end-of-life care.

Exceptions:

Maternity services – One birthing partner

Children – one immediate family member on wards

b. If yes, are any of those policies still in place?

No, throughout the pandemic our visiting guidance was updated based on Government guidance and local need, to support visiting.

i. If yes, which of those policies are still in place?

Not applicable.

2. Does the Trust currently have any visitation policies that:

a. Would prevent a patient from receiving a visitor?

We allow visitation of patients, except in circumstances where it is not appropriate for patients to receive visitors due to their health condition or undergoing surgery.

We are guided by our visiting principles to ensure clinical safety and wellbeing of patients.

Our Visiting principles are:

- Maximum of two visitors per patient at the bedside, at any one time.
- Visiting time is between 11:00 -19:00.
- No more than 2 patients at a bedside a time.
- Consideration should be given to mealtime visiting under the mealtimes matter principles.
- No children under the age of 12.
- Visitors may be asked to leave the bedside, if specific treatment is required

We ask all visitors to ensure they are feeling well enough to visit and inform visitors that the trust may need to make local (ward level) short term changes to visiting.

i. If yes, in what wards or circumstances does this apply?

We may prevent a visitor seeing a patient if there were already:

Two visitors at the bedside (Adult wards)

Two adults and one child visiting (Bristol Royal Hospital for Children)*

Two nominated birthing partners in labour - one partner to all appointments (Maternity)

three adults visiting (Maternity wards)

–Four other named visitors (Neonatal ICU)

ii. If yes, were these restrictions in place before March 2020?

Yes

b. Set a restriction on the number of different people able to visit a patient during their stay

No, except in the below circumstances:

i. If yes, in what wards or circumstances would the number of different people visiting a patient be restricted?

At the time of your visit, there were already:

Two visitors at the bedside (Adult wards)

Two adults and one child visiting (Bristol Royal Hospital for Children)*

Two nominated birthing partners in labour - one partner to all appointments (Maternity)

Three adults already visiting (one of whom is the agreed partner) (Maternity wards)

Four other named visitors (Neonatal ICU)

ii. If yes, how many different people do these restrictions permit as visitors?

Please see above for individual areas.

iii. If yes, were these restrictions in place before March 2020?

Yes

*The total number of visitors allowed for paediatric patients can be flexible in some circumstances, arranged according to patient and family need and location.
