Thank you for your request for information under the Freedom of Information Act 2000. The Trust's response is as follows:

- We can confirm that we do hold the information you are requesting
- 1. As of today's date, how many of your hospitals provide a psychodermatology service on-site? Please name them.

Bristol Royal Infirmary.

2. As of today's date, how many patients with eczema have accessed your psychodermatology services in the last 12 months? What % of patients accessing your psychodermatology services does this represent?

\* patients - 8% of referrals.

Please note: Where the figures are between 1 and 5, this has been denoted by \*. Due to the low numbers, we have considered that there is the potential for individuals to be identified from the information provided, when considered with other information that may also be in the public domain. In our view disclosure of these low figures would breach one of the Data Protection Principles set out in Schedule 1 of the Data Protection Act, namely Principle 1. The Trust therefore finds that the Section 40(2) exemption contained within the Freedom of information Act 2000 is engaged. This follows NHS Digital (formerly HSCIC) analysis guidance (2014) which states that small numbers within local authorities, wards, postcode districts, providers and Trusts may allow identification of patients and should not be published.

3. As of today's date, how many patients with eczema are on the waiting list to access your psychodermatology services? What % of patients waiting to access your psychodermatology services does this represent?

\* patients - 10% of referrals.

6. How far does the patient accessing your psychodermatology services who lives the furthest away from the hospital have to travel? I know that some psychodermatology services around the country are taking patients who live three hours, or more, away as these services are so rare across the UK

- 7. As of today's date, which skin conditions (top 5) were the most commonly referred to your psychodermatology services in the last 12 months? Please rank them 1-5.
- 1. Delusions of Infestation
- 2. Acne/mental health/ Body dysmorphic disorder
- 3. Psychological impact of skin disease- mainly Hidradenitis suppurativa
- 4. Medically unexplained skin symptoms
- 5. Body focused repetitive behaviours
