#### Results

Finding 34 of the 50 women included had taken pre-operative analgesia. Pain scores were recorded during outpatient hysteroscopy. Discovering the average pain score was between 3 and 4 out of 10, although some of the women included had much higher pain scores. Only a small amount of women required local anesthetic during the procedure. Pain scores following hysteroscopy were recorded for one of the 50 patients.

#### Conclusions

Concluding that the current standard is being met with a high level of compliance of 74%, despite this fact, some improvement is required. Average pain levels during the procedure were found to be low. Documentation has since been updated to reflect post-operative pain scores. A second audit is recommended to include updated documentation of post-operative pain levels to determine if analgesia improves patient levels of pain. A patient questionnaire is recommended to provide richer data regarding levels of pain and satisfaction of the outpatient hysteroscopy service.
