Thank you for your request for information under the Freedom of Information Act 2000. The Trust's response is as follows:

Could you please inform me as to the number of pedestrians admitted to the United Hospitals Bristol NHS hospital in 2022 and 2023 who were injured, RTA codes VO1 VO9.

i.e. as a result of collisions with:

pedal cycles
2-3 wheeled motor vehicles
Car pick up truck or van
Other non-motor vehicle
Other and unspecified transport accident

Could you please also inform me as to the number of cyclists admitted to the United Hospitals Bristol NHS hospital in 2022 and 2023 who were injured, RTA codes V10 to V19.

i.e. as a result of collisions with:

pedestrians or animals
other pedal cycles
2-3 wheeled motor vehicles
Car, pick up truck or van
Heavy transport vehicle or bus
Other non-motor vehicle
With fixed/stationary object
Non-collision transport accident

Other and unspecified transport accident

I would be grateful if the numbers could be separately identified for each category.

Please note: Where the figures are between 1 and 5, this has been denoted by *. Due to the low numbers, we have considered that there is the potential for individuals to be identified from the information provided, when considered with other information that may also be in the public domain. In our view disclosure of these low figures would breach one of the Data Protection Principles set out in Schedule 1 of the Data Protection Act, namely Principle 1. The Trust therefore finds that the Section 40(2) exemption contained within the Freedom of information Act 2000 is engaged. This follows NHS Digital (formerly HSCIC) analysis guidance (2014) which states that small numbers within local authorities, wards, postcode districts, providers and Trusts may allow identification of patients and should not be published.
