Dear Sir/Madam

Thank you for your request for information under the Freedom of Information Act 2000. The Trust's response is as follows:

We can confirm that we do hold the information you are requesting.

1. How many patients were discharged from UHBW NHS Foundation Trust hospitals to care homes, between March 1, 2020, and April 15, 2020?

Total: 177 patients.

2. Of those patients discharged, how many were tested for Covid-19 before discharge?

Between March 1st and April 15th, 17 patients discharged to care homes were tested for Covid-19.

Nb: Before April 15th the national guidance was not to test patients for Covid-19 before discharge to a care home. The national guidance was updated on April 16th with the move to a policy of testing all patients being discharged to care homes from hospital. Imminent discharges were already in progress as this was rolled out. All referral forms for discharges to care homes included the patient's current Covid information (i.e patient symptomatic or asymptomatic), plus whether they had been on a ward with Covid-positive patients.

3. Of those patients who were tested, how many patients' results were:

a. Positive: 1b. Negative: 16c. Inconclusive: 0

Carolyn Mills, chief nurse at University Hospitals Bristol and Weston NHS Foundation Trust, said:

"Throughout the pandemic we have followed national guidance in relation to testing our inpatients prior to discharge.

"As the pandemic has progressed, a better understanding about the Covid-19 infection and its transmission has resulted in national guidance that has been reviewed and revised as necessary.

"We have, and continue to, follow the national guidance and work closely with our health and social care partners to ensure our patients are discharged safely."

If, after that, you are dissatisfied with the handling of your request, you have the right to ask for an internal review. Internal review requests should be submitted within two months of the date of receipt of the response to your original letter and should be addressed to:
