If possible can you provide a breakdown of age group; over 18, under 18.

Please note that we cannot identify the reasons for admission for e.g attempted suicide or self-harm. The data has been filtered by patients admitted from ED between Jan-June 2019 and Jan-June 2020. Additional filters of 'self-inflicted injury' and an ED reason for visit of 'Overdose and Poisoning', 'Self-Harm' and 'Mental Illness' have been added.

Please also note that where the figures are less than 5, this has been denoted by <5. Where numbers are low, we have considered that there is the potential for the individuals to be identified from the information provided. In our view, disclosure of these low figures would breach one of the Data Protection Principles set out in Schedule 1 of the Data Protection Act, namely Principle 1, therefore find that the Section 40(2) exemption contained within the Freedom of information Act 2000 is engaged. Section 40 is the exemption for personal information.

This concludes our response. We trust that you find this helpful, but please do not hesitate to contact us directly if we can be of any further assistance.

If, after that, you are dissatisfied with the handling of your request, you have the right to ask for an internal review. Internal review requests should be submitted within two months of the date of receipt of the response to your original letter and should be addressed to:
