We are improving links with local children eating disorder services and working together to develop a collaborative approach to helping younger people access services who are felt to be at risk; piloting the use of a binge eating disorder screened (adolescent binge eating scale and also in the process of consulting with CAMHs (Children and Adolescent Mental Health Services) about trying to identify a care pathway for young people with eating disorders and have regular meetings with CAMHS eating disorder specialist in which we are able to see advice on ways to identify any other forms of eating disorder pattern.
