Neurodevelopmental assessment <i>Children and young people with confirmed prenatal alcohol exposure or all 3 facial features associated with prenatal alcohol exposure have a neurodevelopmental assessment if there are clinical concerns.</i>	Not applicable	Primarily relevant to Community Paediatrics (Sirona) Maternity /Neonatal services would highlight these findings for future assessment
5. Management plan <i>Children and young people with a diagnosis of fetal alcohol spectrum disorder (FASD) have a management plan to address their needs.</i>	Not applicable	Primarily relevant to Community Paediatrics (Sirona) and possibly CAMHS (AWP).
