# How many staff had an influenza vaccine in each year over the last 5 years (ideally broken down by division/staff group).

Please see the attached document. Please note that this does not include vaccinations given off-site, or vaccinations given to staff without direct patient contact.

## What is the target number of staff we want to get vaccinated.

The 23/24 national CQUIN target is 75% of frontline staff, however in addition to this target, acute hospital trusts are expected to deliver a 100% offer of flu and COVID-19 vaccinations to eligible groups (including many non-frontline staff who are part of the eligible cohorts for reasons of age, health conditions, or carer status). The target number for the 23/24 flu vaccination programme was between around 14,000 (frontline cohort) and 15,722 (total staff headcount). ## Do students and volunteers get offered a vaccine.

## Are any patient groups offered a vaccine.

Inpatients are offered a vaccine, however, this only applies to a very small cohort of patients who are fit enough to get vaccinated, have missed or may miss their opportunity to be vaccinated in the community and fall within the parameters of each campaign, as this is stipulated in the campaign-specific guidance letters by NHS England. Clinical teams identify said patients and request that the vaccination team complete the vaccine. This includes both children and adults. Provisions are also made for maternity outpatients to be offered the flu vaccine, if applicable.

## Is there a health promotion strategy/model the trust uses to promote vaccine uptake.

There is a comprehensive communications campaign, coordinated by the Trust's communications team, aligning with national and regional messages and linking in with the ICB vaccine-specific comms programme and resourcing and there are local incentives available for uptake (for example, coffee vouchers donated by on-premises companies). Incentives are also available to staff who have had their seasonal vaccine off the premises, to encourage reporting. Managers are encouraged to allow staff time away from their work area to be vaccinated, and vaccination progress is reported at Trust-wide and divisional levels. The Trust staff vaccination service adopts a flexible model to ensure choice and accessibility for all staff.
