Thank you for your request for information under the Freedom of Information Act 2000. The Trust's response is as follows:

We can confirm that we hold some of the information you are requesting

Question 1. How many patients have a current diagnosis for Spinal Muscular Atrophy (ICD-10 Code G12.0, G12.1, G12.8 and G12.9) at your trust?

We do not hold this information. We can only provide information for patients who have a diagnosis recorded against a hospital stay. The total number of patients who have these diagnosis codes recorded against them is 100

Question 2. How many patients have been treated in the last 4 months (September to December 2024) with the following products:

- Evrysdi (Risdiplam) 12
- Spinraza (Nusinersen) **
- Zolgensma (Onasemnogene) **
- Evrysdi (Risdiplam) *(new patients) **
- Spinraza (Nusinersen) *(new patients) 0
- Zolgensma (Onasemnogene) *(new patients) **
- *new patients are defined as patients who were not treated with any of Spinraza (Nusinersen), Evrysdi (Risdiplam) or Zolgensma (Onasemnogene) in the previous 4-month period (May to August 2024).

Please note: Where the figures are between 1 and 5, this has been denoted by **. Due to the low numbers, we have considered that there is the potential for individuals to be identified from the information provided, when considered with other information that may also be in the public domain. In our view disclosure of these low figures would breach one of the Data Protection Principles set out in Schedule 1 of the Data Protection Act, namely Principle 1. The Trust therefore finds that the Section 40(2) exemption contained within the Freedom of information Act 2000 is engaged. This follows NHS Digital (formerly HSCIC) analysis guidance (2014) which states that small numbers within local authorities, wards, postcode districts,
