Thank you for your request for information under the Freedom of Information Act 2000. The Trust's response is as follows:

2) Any recorded dental or oral health conditions linked to nicotine pouch use within your Trust's dental services.

Please note: Where the figures are between 1 and 5, this has been denoted by \*. Due to the low numbers, we have considered that there is the potential for individuals to be identified from the information provided, when considered with other information that may also be in the public domain. In our view disclosure of these low figures would breach one of the Data Protection Principles set out in Schedule 1 of the Data Protection Act, namely Principle 1. The

Trust therefore finds that the Section 40(2) exemption contained within the Freedom of information Act 2000 is engaged. This follows NHS Digital (formerly HSCIC) analysis guidance (2014) which states that small numbers within local authorities, wards, postcode districts, providers and Trusts may allow identification of patients and should not be published.

## 3) If applicable, reports from NHS dentists highlighting concerns about gum disease, oral cancers, or other conditions related to nicotine pouches.

## 4) Any internal reports, risk assessments, or discussions about the health impact of nicotine pouch use within your trust.

At an Oral Medicine Governance meeting held on 30/1/2025, an audit was presented that included information on the use and health impact of smokeless tobacco and nicotine pouches. This was discussed at a departmental level. Please see the attached document.
