The Trust's response is as follows: We can confirm that we do not hold the information you are requesting I'm writing to request the following information under the Freedom of Information Act 2000. Please would you be able to provide: 1. Any data on hospital admissions, A&E visits, or GP consultations where nicotine pouches were recorded as a contributing factor, for 2023, 2024, and 2025. Please disaggregate this data by: • Type of admission (eg A&E visit, hospital admission or GP consultation) □Year • □ Age of patient (either under 18 or over 18) • ☐ Health condition related to nicotine pouch use Please note, the Trust does not hold the data in a format that would enable us to fully respond to your request to the level of detail required and a manual trawl for this information would significantly exceed the 18 hours limit set down by the FOI as the reasonable limit. Section 12 of the FOIA provides that we are not obliged to spend in excess of 18 hours in any sixty-day period locating, retrieving and identifying information in order to deal with a request for information and therefore we are withholding this information at this time. 2. Any data on patients with recorded dental or oral health conditions linked to nicotine pouch use within your Trust's dental services, for 2023, 2024 and 2025. Please disaggregate this data by: □Year • □ Age of patient (either under 18 or over 18) Type of oral health condition

Note that I am only requesting statistical information in aggregate form and do not

If this request runs the risk of triggering a cost exemption, please could you provide me with as much of the information as possible, working backwards in time from 2025 –

require any personal details or identifiers about individual cases.

2024 – 2023, within the appropriate time limit. Please prioritise the number of patients and the type of health condition related to nicotine pouch use if this is the case. If you are unable to provide this data, for example because of the way in which your patient records are recorded, please elaborate on the specific filing system that you use and comment more generally as to whether your trust has seen the use of nicotine pouches being a health (dental or otherwise) issue.

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Please note the system used is Careflow EPR.
